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### Length of Semester

Prior to 1972-73: Eighteen (18) weeks  
 Fall 1972 to Spring 1991: Sixteen (16) weeks  
 Fall 1991 to Present: Fifteen (15) weeks

### Unit of Credit

Semester Hours (Each fifty-three (53) minutes of recitation per week, per semester, and 110 minutes of Laboratory per week, per semester generally yields one semester hour of credit).

### Course Numbers Since Fall 1972

The three digit number which follows the alphabetical abbreviations generally to be interpreted as follows: 000=no credit towards graduation; 100=open to all students; 200=open to all students who have the prerequisites; 300=professional or advanced course, normally not open to freshmen; 400=professional or advanced course normally not open to sophomores; 500=graduate course (seniors with permission); 600=graduate only

### Graduation Requirements

#### Effective Fall 2001

- 128 semester hours needed in all undergraduate programs in the School of Business and all BA programs in the School of Culture and Society except secondary education programs; the BS in law and justice; the BS in mathematics (statistics) and the BSN in the School of Nursing.
- A minimum of 128 semester hours needed in all other programs, except Engineering Science which required 133 semester hours.

#### Effective June 1997 through Summer 2001

- 120 semester hours needed in all undergraduate programs in the School of Business and all BA programs in the School of Arts and Sciences except secondary education programs; the BS in law and justice; and the BSN in the School of Nursing.
- A minimum of 128 semester hours needed in all other programs, except Engineering Science which requires 133 semester hours.

#### From May 1969 through December 1976

- 124 semester hours were required.
- Semester hour requirements for graduate programs vary according to the program.
